

Film Barnet in 90 Seconds

Barnet Council in association with Film London and Hendon Times invites you to submit a 90 second film about your borough, giving you a chance to win a cash prize of £150 or £50 Amazon vouchers and the opportunity of having your film screened before a public audience in 2010. Your film should explore what your borough means to you – for example what excites you, what inspires you, what you love, or what you would like to see in the borough of Barnet.

Competition Guidelines

Submission

- The primary contact for the film must be the individual who is named in the application form and be resident or studying in Barnet.
- The deadline for entries is 22 March 2010.
- There are two age categories: **11-24 years old** and **25 years old and over**.
- All films must be submitted **by post** to the address at the bottom of this form.
- DVDs or CDs of all films submitted must be marked with the title of the film, the name of the film-maker and a contact phone number and email.
- You may submit up to two films.
- Films (up to a maximum of two) must be accompanied by an application form (submitted films without a form will not be accepted).
- Only films completed since January 2009 may be submitted. We strongly encourage film-makers to make a film specifically for this competition, rather than submit an older project or re-edit a longer project to fit the 90 second limit.
- We recommend that the submitted film is not shown online (for example Facebook, YouTube or MySpace) before the results of the competition are announced.

Length, Genre and Format

- The length of your film must not exceed 90 seconds including titles and credits. (Please note you must include the title in your film, but the use of credits is optional).
- Film Barnet in 90 seconds accepts films of any form (for example fiction, documentary, experimental, animation or any combination of these). The competition is not open to films advertising products or services.
- Films can be made on any format (for example mobile phones, digital video or film).
- All films must be able to be viewed on a computer or dvd player and therefore should be playable on a standard DVD or submitted either as a .mov file (Quicktime movie file) a Window's Media File (.wmv) an .avi or .mkv files.
- All films must be submitted either on DVD or CD.

Copyright, Credits and Licence

- The person submitting the film must be the person named in the completed application form and must have gained the necessary permissions for the use of any copyrighted music and / or copyrighted images used within the film. **We strongly recommend that you include only original music and sound during your film.** For an explanation about copyright, what it is, and obtaining permissions, Film London suggests you read this article: www.4docs.org.uk/wiki/index.php/Copyright
- By submitting a film to the competition you automatically grant Barnet Council and Film London permission to exhibit the film on a non-exclusive basis whereby the film can be shown by Barnet Council and Film London in connection with this



competition, without either Barnet Council or Film London seeking further permissions.

- For each person under 18 years old appearing in your film, a parental consent form will need to be completed and returned with your entry. This can be downloaded from www.barnet.gov.uk/film-competition
- Barnet Council and Film London will require a credit on your film, should you be selected as the best of your borough. You do not have to include a credit for either Barnet Council or Film London when submitting your film, but be aware that a credit will be required to be added later for exhibition purposes.

Selection and Prize

- Your film will be judged by council officers and representatives from Film London, Phoenix Cinema and Hendon Times.
- The winning film in each age group will be awarded a cash prize of £150. The runners-up will receive a £50 Amazon voucher.
- The winning film from each participating borough will be judged by a panel of film industry professionals who will choose one overall winner – The Best of Film London in 90 Seconds.
- The Best of Film London in 90 Seconds film, will be shown at a public screening during a presentation in Summer 2010
